A BENCH FOR CAPS

Students have been collecting plastic lids to be molded into new park benches for the school grounds.

The company, Green Tree Plastics, has created “A Bench for Caps” program to demonstrate to children how much of an impact they can make on the world around them with something so small as a bottle cap.

Caps can be used from: medicine bottles, milk jugs, laundry detergent, hair spray, toothpaste tubes, deodorant, drink bottles, flip-top (ketchup, etc.), spout caps (mustard), spray paint, ointment tubes and caps with recycle numbers 2, 4 or 5.

Lids from cottage cheese, mayonnaise, yogurt, peanut butter, ice cream buckets, cool whip, coffee cans, cream cheese and tub butter are also acceptable.

To order a 6 foot bench, students need to collect 400 lbs. of acceptable plastic caps and lids.
